

- In considering the need for a special light to be exhibited by patrol vessels, the Sub-Committee on Safety of Navigation at its twenty-eighth session was informed that for that purpose some Administrations require an all-round flashing blue light and that other Administrations might require a variety of other lights for such vessels.
- In this regard it was recalled that the International Code of Signals will be amended to include use of blue flashing lights for the identification of medical transports in armed conflicts (NAV 28/12, Annex 6).
- In order to assess the current use of blue flashing and fixed lights by sea-going vessels and signals to identify patrol vessels, Administrations are invited to complete the attached Questionnaire for examination at the Sub-Committee's twenty-ninth session.
